# Advances in Canine and Feline Lymphoma

## Message from the Guest Editor

Research and publications in recent years have allowed for a greater characterization of the different biological entities included under the definition of lymphoma. Laboratory analyses have played an important role, but the usefulness of an integrated approach between different competences and the need to deepen the knowledge in a multidisciplinary way have become clear. This is especially true for the dog, for whom the acquired knowledge has led to its recognition as a possible spontaneous animal model for the human counterpart. Much of this work is still to be addressed for feline lymphomas, whose peculiarities place greater limits both to clinicians and researchers. Many aspects remain to be clarified or explored both in canine and feline lymphomas and the need for more (and more specific) diagnostic and prognostic laboratory tests as well as for a greater effort to discover new potential target for therapy is emerging.
