Innovative Methods and Applications of Stormwater Management

Message from the Guest Editors

Stormwater management from urban, traffic and commercial areas is a continuous challenge and comprises a wide variety of aspects. In the last two decades a clear paradigm shift from quick drainage to water sensitive design has taken place, aiming at maintaining a near natural water balance, reducing adverse impacts on receiving waters or integrating stormwater treatment as architectural multi purpose elements into urban planning. Related research ranges from improved analysis and modelling of stormwater, systems elements and processes to the development and assessment of technical solutions up to city planning and socio-economic consideration. Recently identified challenges like climate change, increasing inner agglomeration, emerging pollutants require deeper investigation and intensified attempts for longterm sustainable solutions. This also requires a thorough review of lessons learned, including operational, institutional and social issues. The objective of this special issue is to compile innovative articles comprising the whole range of stormwater treatment and stimulate a cross-regional, cross-sectoral discussion on sustainable stormwater management.
