Message from the Guest Editors

In irrigated agriculture, study of the various ways water infiltrates soils is necessary. In this respect, soil hydraulic properties, such as moisture retention curve (SMRC), diffusivity, and hydraulic conductivity functions, play a crucial role, as they control the infiltration process and the soil water and solute movement. Modeling and flow simulation of soil water movement depends on the appropriate description of the hydraulic properties and their measurements (in situ and in the laboratory). A comprehensive review of recent developments in the various aspects of soil water movement in irrigated agriculture is welcome. The above may be presented in a number of research topics that tackle one or more of the following challenges:

- Irrigation systems and one-, two-, and three-dimensional soil water movement;
- One- and three-dimensional infiltration analysis from tension and mini disc infiltrometers;
